2	A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING AND SUPPORTING THE NEED FOR FEDERAL RULE CHANGES TO REDUCE METHANE WASTE IN OIL AND GAS PRODUCTION.
4	WHEREAS, energy development is critically important to the economy of both
5	Bernalillo County and the State of New Mexico; and
6	WHEREAS, the State of New Mexico is the nation's leading producer of oil, and the
7	second leading producer of natural gas, on federal lands; and
8	WHEREAS, oil and gas revenue is the cornerstone of New Mexico's educational funding
9	and the state is facing a multimillion-dollar budget shortfall; and
10	WHEREAS, the United States Bureau of Land Management (BLM) has the authority
11	and duty to ensure a fair return for publicly-owned oil and gas resources under the Mineral
12	Leasing Act of 1920; and
13	WHEREAS, a 2013 report by ICF International found that a significant amount of
14	natural gas worth as much as \$330 million was lost through leaks, flaring and venting on federal
15	and tribal lands, enough natural gas to provide energy for 1.5 million homes for one year; and
16	WHEREAS, a recent National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) study
17	discovered a very large and highly concentrated methane plume above the Four Corners region
18	where much of New Mexico's natural gas production occurs; and
19	WHEREAS, BLM does not charge royalties or charges reduced royalty rates on methane
20	the primary component of natural gas - that is leaked, flared or vented; and
21	WHEREAS, according to Senate Memorial 29 introduced by Senator Benny Shendo Jr.
22	during New Mexico's 52 nd Legislature, nearly 45 percent of all BLM applications to flare royalty
23	free come from New Mexico; and

1	WHEREAS, data suggests that since 2010, New Mexico has lost \$50 million in royalties
2	due to wasted methane emissions; and
3	WHEREAS, BLM is proposing new rules entitled "Venting and Flaring: Waste
4	Prevention and Use of Produced Oil and Gas for Beneficial Purposes" that would modernize how
5	the government accounts for methane waste on public and tribal lands; and
6	WHEREAS, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has proposed
7	new rules and guidance for the oil and gas industry under the Federal Clean Air Act to help
8	combat climate change and reduce air pollution that harms public health; and
9	WHEREAS, according to Senate Memorial 29, estimates suggest that as much as ninety
10	percent (90%) of the natural gas being wasted through flaring could be captured or put to use;
11	and
12	WHEREAS, the state of Colorado saw a marked increase in natural gas production and
13	job creation after adopting state rules to cut methane waste, with some companies addressing the
14	issue prior to rules being adopted by the state; and
15	WHEREAS, reducing methane waste would bring critical public health benefits to our
16	communities located near oil and gas extraction and processing sites, by simultaneously cutting
17	ground-level ozone forming gases and cancer causing pollutants such as benzene and other
18	volatile organic compounds; and
19	WHEREAS, it is estimated that the proposed BLM methane rule would generate \$6.7M
20	to \$8.1M in royalties for New Mexico – additional revenue critical to helping address education
21	needs statewide; and

1	WHEREAS, efforts to eliminate methane emissions would create high-quality jobs,
2	economic development in the domestic oil and gas manufacturing and service sectors, and
3	provide much needed royalty revenue to the state to invest in areas of greatest need; and
4	NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners, the
5	governing body of the County of Bernalillo, fully supports stronger EPA and BLM methane
6	rules to reduce wasteful natural gas venting, flaring and leakage from oil and gas operations
7	occurring on private, federal and tribal lands and thereby protecting the health, welfare and
8	potential revenue rightfully due to the citizens of New Mexico.
9	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Bernalillo County Commission fully supports
0	charging royalties for wasted, vented or flared methane gas that could otherwise be captured and
1	taken out of the atmosphere.
2	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be distributed to members
3	of the New Mexico Congressional Delegation, and relevant units of the U.S. Department of the
14	Interior including, the Bureau of Land Management and the Bureau of Indian Affairs, and the
15	U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.
